Greetings,

As spring arrives I look forward to the many colors of spring flowers with their beautiful vibrant colors. Everywhere you look is an inspiration to be used in a quilt.

What do all the colors of flowers mean?

Red, symbol of passion and love.

White, is a symbol of purity.

Pink, symbol of tenderness and sweetness.

Green, symbolizes hope.

Yellow, symbol of energy and optimism.

Orange color embodies the joy of living.

What color is the good luck flower? Green flowers: Harmony and luck. The symbolism behind green flowers is good luck, good fortune, harmony, resilience, wellness, good health, optimism, rebirth or renewal, springtime, and youthfulness. Green is also good for healing. It symbolizes life and relaxes the body and mind, and is also known to improve eyesight. People also believe that the color green has healing powers.

Purple and green are also key colors for attracting prosperity.

Color has a powerful impact on mood. Red is considered auspicious and powerful. In addition red has been shown to increase the heart rate and stimulate the brain, making it a powerful aid in attracting attention.

Did you know Blue is the rarest flower color? Blue is another notable color for catching the eye.

Journeys began in 2007 when twelve Central Oregon quilters formed a group to explore assorted quilting and fiber art techniques, taking their craft to a higher level. They are currently a 10 member strong group that meets monthly to support one another in their journey, sharing techniques, successes and challenges. Each artist works her craft individually, but their monthly gathering creates an energy that inspires and motivates members to a higher level of creativity. May 2– Sandra Henderson “It’s Not Going to Paducah: The celebration of everyday quilts” A presentation and trunk show

Most of all, she will encourage you to be kind to yourself as you challenge yourself to expand your quilt horizons. She will share her experiences (and quilts) from over 40 years of quilting and will also share stories from other quilters and their everyday quilts.



June 6th - Jill Monley “Historical Textile Art Forms from Around the World”

Following her retirement in 2003, Jill was able to return to her love of fabric and sewing by becoming an avid quilter during her personal time. In 2017 she served as Artist in Residence at Empty Spools, a series of quilt related seminars/workshops held at the Asilomar Conference Grounds in Pacific Grove California. In 2020 – 2021 Jill had the opportunity to travel the world visiting 36 countries. Like many quilters who are always on the lookout for creative ideas, she was intrigued by the different textile art forms she observed during her year-long journey. 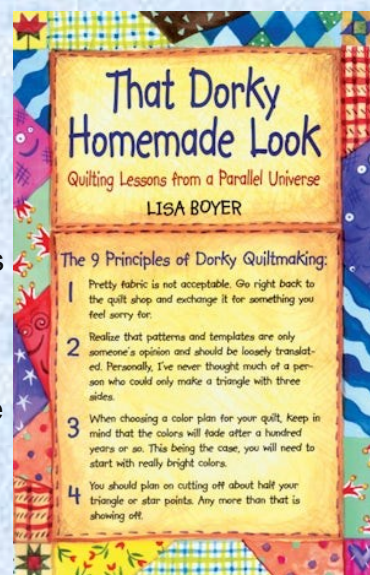

LAP QUILTS FOR SENIORS—Wheel Chair and Others

WE HAVE COLLECTED 24 QUILTS ALREADY.

General information for [Home Instead](#) senior wheelchair and lap quilts.

These are given out as Christmas gifts. They will accept crochet or knit quilts as well as fabric quilts.

Their goal is around 300 quilts for the Redmond area, but we could not make a commitment to any number at this time.

They will take red, white and blue quilts (not quilts of valor) for lap quilts only, not wheelchair quilts, for veterans.

The suggested sizes for quilts are as follows:

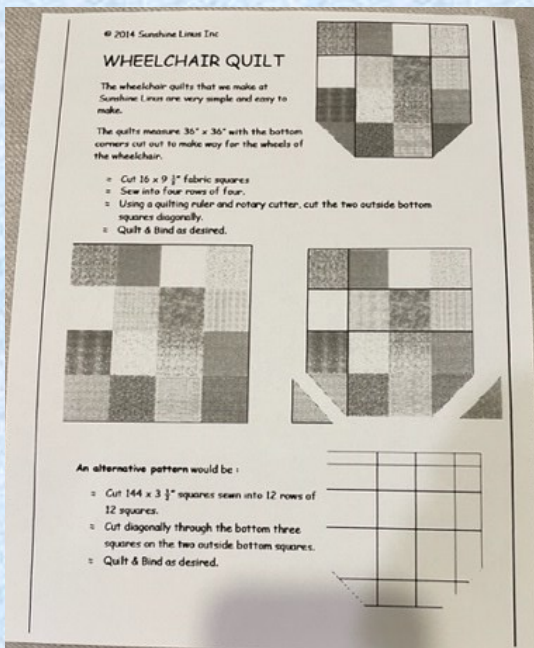
Small would be 36" wide x 38" long

Large would be 38" wide x 40" long

Lap quilts should be 40" x 52" approximately

Cut quilt bottoms will be for wheelchairs and lap quilts will be for people in walkers or non-mobile.

You can add a pocket or muff if you wish (please line with flannel) leaving enough room for large hands. For ideas or specifics on the pocket, please see Pam Sommers.

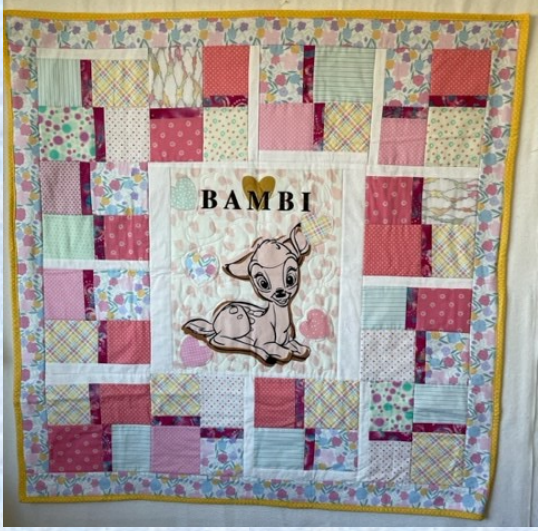
WOW! That is a record! I have never received that number before. I wonder if it had anything to do with the snow and cold weather we had in January and February!!!
