## PRESIDENT'S LETTER

March 2024

Greetings,

WOW! What an amazing presentation by Scott Gillies at our February meeting. Who would have thought there were so many ways to look at color. Big thank you to program committee for the awesome presentation.

We are starting a new community project this year: lap quilts and wheelchair lap quilts for seniors. Since this community project started in 2024 and our 2024 budget was set in 2023, there are no funds allocated to purchase fabric, backing, or batting. I am certain everyone has some fabric that leaves you wondering why you bought it or can't remember what project you purchased it for; I know I do. I am certain seniors will enjoy anything we can make. So dig into that stash. Basic Wheelchair lap quilts are 36 X 36 or 36 X 48. Regular lap quilts can be 36 X 48, 60 X 70, 60 X 36 or 42 X 48. Just about any size will work. So many sizes to choose from, so lets get started. The wheel chair quilts that are 36 X 36 are generally 16 9 1/2" square blocks (4 blocks X 4 blocks) sewn together with the corner blocks on one side, cut on the diagonal.

We also have our quilts for kids, Quilts of Valor, Honor Flight Quilts, and now senior lap quilts. (And save those scrapes to help fill dog and cat beds for the animal shelter ) So many choices to get involved with. This looks to be a busy year with our community projects.

# LAP QUILTS FOR SENIORS—Wheel Chair and Others

General information for [Home Instead](#) senior wheelchair and lap quilts.

These are given out as Christmas gifts. They will accept crochet or knit quilts as well as fabric quilts.

Their goal is around 300 quilts for the Redmond area, but we could not make a commitment to any number at this time.

They will take red, white and blue quilts (not quilts of valor) for lap quilts only, not wheelchair quilts, for veterans.

The suggested sizes for quilts are as follows:

Small would be 36" wide x 38" long

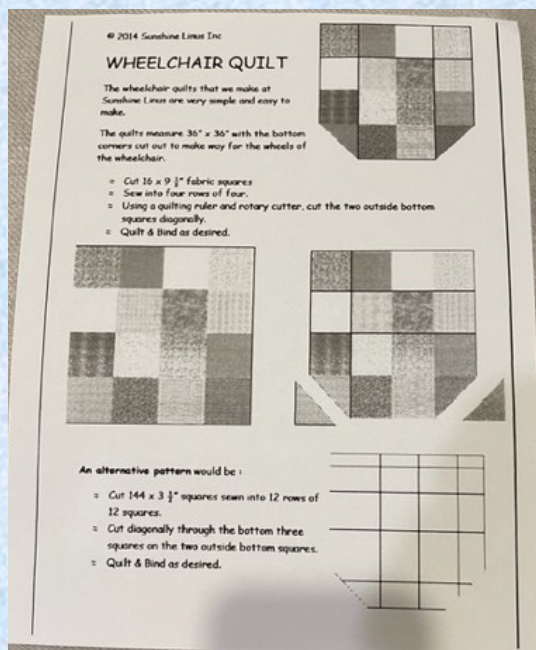
Large would be 38" wide x 40" long

Lap quilts should be 40" x 52" approximately

Cut quilt bottoms will be for wheelchairs and lap quilts will be for people in walkers or non-mobile.

You can add a pocket or muff if you wish (please line with flannel) leaving enough room for large hands. For ideas or specifics on the pocket, please see Pam Sommers.

Delivery to Home Instead will be done the last week in November. Home Instead will be wrapping the quilts December 11<sup>th</sup> in the event that you would be willing to volunteer to wrap with them.

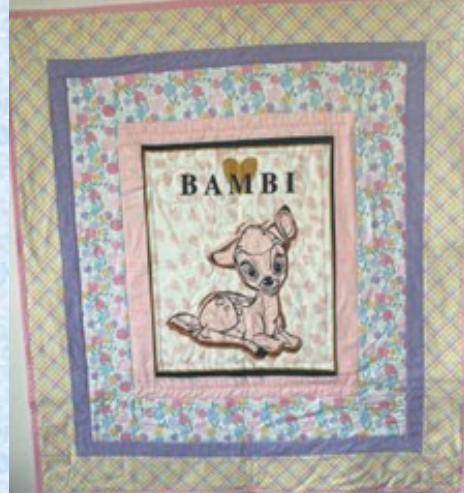

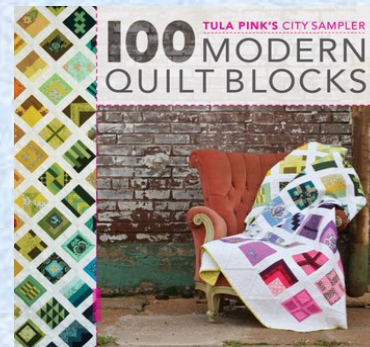
# HDQG LIBRARY— LET'S GET COLORFUL AND MODERN WITH TULA PINK AND KAFFE FASSETT

This month the library is highlighting two books by famous quilters – Tula Pink and Kaffe Fassett.

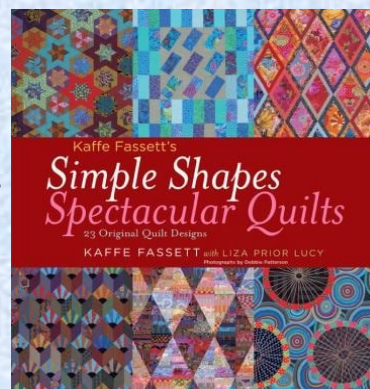
## Tula Pink's City Sampler: 100 Modern Quilt Blocks –

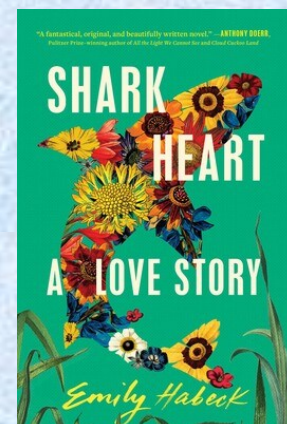
Please include on the quilt label: Name of Quilt, Your Name, Email, and Phone number.

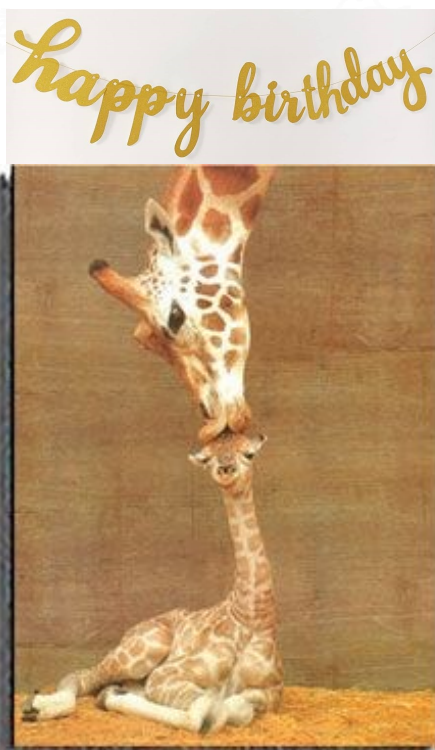

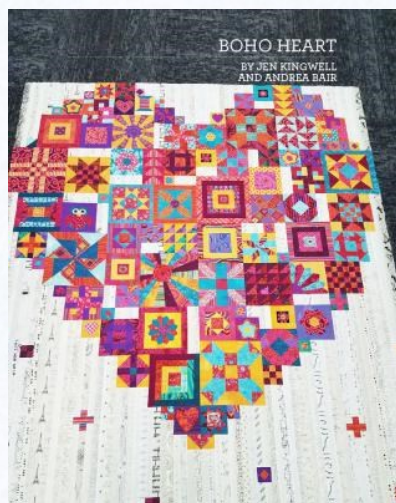
## FRIENDSHIP GROUPS FOCUS—Jen Kingwell

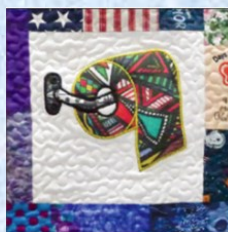
